Coxswain Course

Course Aim

The **Coxswain course** is a compulsory course for persons who wish to take command of a commercial vessel up to 12 metres in length with associated engine equipment of a capacity of up to 250kw (339.91 HP)

The curriculum of this course is nationally recognised and designed to meet the training requirements for the:-

Certificate II in Transport and Distribution (Coastal Maritime Operations - Coxswain) TDM20307
and is commonly known as a **Coxswain Certificate**.

Course Duration and Learning Environment

The course is conducted off site electronically, in a class room environment and practically on board a commercial vessel. The online component can be commenced at anytime. Practical sessions are conducted over 5 days each month.

Throughout the on board practical sessions students will be required to actively participate in simulated fire and emergency drills, mooring, anchoring, operating a marine radio, understand marine propulsion systems, including main and auxiliary engines, be able to navigate a vessel in inshore waters, and contribute to the relevant safety procedures required on board a commercial vessel.

- Operate Marine Propulsion systems
- Coastal Navigation
